Goffman (1963) defined stigma as 'an attribute that is deeply discrediting within a particular interaction'. In other words, it is an undesirable characteristic in a particular context - for example, cohabitation before marriage was greatly frowned upon in England during the first part of the 19 th century, but today is considered normal and is even encouraged.
