Plan each Gradual Release Model lesson by first establishing a clear purpose or lesson objective (e.g., identifying the main idea and details). Decide how to model the skill (e.g., boxes and bullets) and prepare think alouds to promote metacognition while students observe and listen during the "I Do" phase (e.g., name decision-making processes, alert learners about errors to avoid).

The Gradual Release Of Responsibility (GRR) model may be implemented in a single period/lesson or over the course of several days as a means of scaffolding instruction. Because students' content, language, and metacognitive needs vary, differentiation of instruction is recommended at key stages of the lesson, especially for struggling ...

Strategic Lesson/Learning Plans - DePaul University

The gradual release of responsibility (also known as I do, we do, you do) is a teaching strategy that includes demonstration, prompt, and practice. At the beginning of a lesson or when new material is being introduced, the teacher has a prominent role in the delivery of the content. This is the "I do" phase.
