Rules for Writing Numbers

When numbers are in a list, it's best to keep all the numbers in the list consistent, even if some numbers are under 10 and some are over: Incorrect: She has four brothers aged seven, nine, 12, and 15. Correct: She has four brothers aged 7, 9, 12, and 15.

Here is a quick overview of the rules for writing numbers. Small numbers. Numbers smaller than ten should be spelled out. Two birds were sitting on a branch. (NOT '2 birds were sitting on a branch.']) Two-word numbers should be expressed in figures. Examples are: 24, 32, 56 etc. I got only 35 marks in English.

For general writing, most guides agree that you should use words for the numbers one through nine, but for larger numbers the rules vary wildly from style guide to style guide. Some say to use words for the numbers one to one hundred, one to ten, any word that can be written with one or two words, and so on.

It is generally best to write out numbers from zero to one hundred in nontechnical writing. In scientific and technical writing, the prevailing style is to write out numbers under ten. While there are exceptions to these rules, your predominant concern should be expressing numbers consistently.

The use of parentheses to indicate a negative number is typically seen on spreadsheets, not in formal writing, to which our rules apply. Rule 1 in the Parentheses section of GrammarBook.com says, "Use parentheses to enclose words or figures that clarify or are used as an aside."

Fractions, Decimals, and Money - Grammar and Punctuation

Numbers over one hundred should not contain the word "and". Examples: one hundred one, one hundred eleven, one hundred twenty-one. Two related numbers in a sentence should match in style. For instance, if one is writing about a choice between nine cookies or twenty-five cookies, the numbers should match in style.

Another basic rule for writing numbers is you should never start a sentence with a digit, regardless of the size of the number. For example, you should never say "2,000 tickets were sold for the event." Instead, it should say "Two thousand tickets were sold for the event."
