Definition and Examples of Correlative Conjunctions

When using a correlative conjunction, the words, phrases, or clauses following each part should be parallel. In the first sentence, the construction of the second part of the sentence does not match the construction of the first part. In the second sentence, omitting needless words and matching verb constructions create a parallel structure.

Position your correlative conjunctions in your sentence so the same type of word follows each one. In other words, use a parallel structure. Don't use a comma with a correlative conjunction unless the words after it could be a standalone sentence (i.e., contain a subject, a verb and convey a complete idea).

When using correlative conjunctions, be sure to keep parallel structure intact. Equal grammatical units need to be

incorporated into the entire sentence. For example: Not only did Mary grill burgers for Michael, but she also fixed a steak for her dog, Vinny.

Correlative conjunctions work together and relate one sentence element to another. As far as I know, the connected elements just need to carry equal importance. It is prudent -- but not required -- to make sure the sentence structures they connect have a parallel structure (i.e. be similar in length or grammatical structure).

parallelism - When Correlative Conjunctions are NOT ...

Correlative conjunctions call for parallel structure. Parallel structure must be used in order to create balanced sentences. The parts of the sentence that follow the conjunction must be grammatically equal.

When you use correlative conjunctions, be careful about parallel structure. Either... or, neither... nor, and not only... but also require special attention when you are proofreading for parallelism. Be sure that you have equal grammatical units after both parts of the conjunction. You can have two main clauses like this:

A sentence exhibits parallelism if similar ideas are expressed using the same syntactic and grammatical structure. Writers use parallel structures to communicate ideas that have the same importance using the same grammatical structure.
