Down syndrome is a condition in which a person has an extra chromosome. Chromosomes are small “packages” of genes in the body. They determine how a baby’s body forms during pregnancy and how the baby’s body functions as it grows in the womb and after birth. Typically, a baby is born with 46 chromosomes.

After birth, the initial diagnosis of Down syndrome is often based on the baby's appearance. But the features associated with Down syndrome can be found in babies without Down syndrome, so your health care provider will likely order a test called a chromosomal karyotype to confirm diagnosis.

The ratio you receive expresses your baby's chances of having Down syndrome. A risk of 1 in 100 means that for every 100 women with this result, one baby will have Down syndrome and 99 will not. A risk of 1 in 1,200 means that for every 1,200 women with this result, one baby will have Down syndrome and 1,199 will not.
